ON THE GOSPEL

...and brings them up into a very high mountain apart.

They knew that He was man; but they knew not that He was God. They knew Him as the son of Mary, and as a man sharing in the daily life of the world. On the mountain, He revealed to them that He was the Son of God, and Himself God. For they knew that He hungered and that He ate; that He thirsted and that He drank; that He labored and that He took rest; that He felt need of sleep and that He slept; that He feared and that He sweated. And all of this belonged not to His divine nature, but only to His humanity; and therefore He lead them up the mountain, so that the father may with His own voice call Him Son, and that He may show that He is in truth His Son, and God.
