**This week**, on Monday and Tuesday, Fr. Hathaway will be in Spearfish attending the Pastoral Ministry Days. He will offer the 8:00 am Mass at ICC on those days then depart for Spearfish. Also, on Tuesday evening, he will attend the evening Chrim Mass at OLPH.

**Pilgrimage plans:** St. Michael's local chapter of The Confraternity of St Peter is planning a 2- night, 3-day pilgrimage to Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary in Denton, NE. On day 1, we will drive to Alexandria, SD where we will visit the Carmelite convent, offer Mass, and spend the night. On day 2, we will drive to Denton, visit the seminary, offer Mass (in its new chapel) and spend the night. Exactly where we will spend the nights (homes or hotels) will be determined by the numbers of people who will attend this event. **A clarification:** at the recent Parish Council meeting, Fr. Mulloy, Rector of the Cathedral of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, wished it be known that the permission to allow the Hausman children to receive their First Confession and First Communion at ICC in the Former Rite did not come from the Cathedral simply (as the bulletin indicated) but from Bishop Cupich who is the Pastor of the Cathedral and ICC. *Summorum Pontificum* grants pastors this faculty: *Art. 9. § 1 The pastor, having attentively examined all aspects, may also (besides holy Mass, presented earlier) grant permission to use the earlier ritual for the administration of the Sacraments of Baptism, Marriage, Penance, and the Anointing of the Sick, if the good of souls would seem to require it. § 2 Ordinaries are given the right to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation using the earlier Roman Pontifical, if the good of souls would seem to require it.* Finally, should it be wondered, please know that Fr. Hathaway is not a pastor, but only an assistant to the pastor. An assistant pastor works under a pastor's oversight of his parish community.
