The *Pange Lingua* will be began when the priest leaves the main altar. The order of hymns is: to 1st altar - *Pange Lingua* (TRH 122); to 2nd altar - Jesus My Lord; to 3rd altar - *Ave Verum Corpus* (TRH 103); return to main altar - Sing My Tongue. At each altar, before the Benediction, the *Tantum Ergo* (TRH 123) is said. Single sheet handouts are provided at the entrances of the church.
