ON THE GOSPEL

Whosoever is angry with his brother...

There are degrees in these sins. The first is to be angry, but to hold it in the mind. It is worse, if this or that emotion leads to utterance, hurtful to the one with who we are angry. It is worse still if one cries out with real cursing. There is a similar gradation in the punishment. "Judgment" is a lesser thing, because even though it deals with a guilty person, there is room for defense. "The Council" is a more serious matter: the judges confer together about the penalty to be inflicted, having agreed that sentence must be passed. "Hell" is still worse, because there is no remission of sentence. In this way, things which cannot be expressed in precise and distinct terms can be distinguished by these analogies. In these three expressions – judgment, the Council, hell – different kinds of punishments are referred to, each according to the type of sin.
