Some liturgical notes for November:

All Saints' Day is a holy day of obligation in the Universal Church and in the U.S.

The month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls. On all days from Nov. 1 through Nov. 8 inclusive, a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Poor Souls, is granted to those who visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed. Partial indulgences are granted to those who recite Lauds or Vespers of the Office of the Dead, and to those who recite the prayer "*Requiem aeternum dona eis Domini, et lux perpetua luceat eis. Requiescant in pace*" (Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace").

Daily Mass for the Dead can be offered every fourth or third class day of the week from Nov. 3 through Nov. 8.

On All Souls' Day (Nov. 2) the faithful may hold lit candles during the gospel, and again from the Sanctus through the end of the Canon, and again for the Absolution after the Mass. The priest says *Requiescant in pace* instead of *Ite, missa est*. There is no final blessing. Also, the priest may say three Masses but may keep only one stipend. Priests who say three masses must say one for all the faithful departed and one for the Holy Father's intentions. If only one mass is said, it is the formula of the first mass. A plenary indulgence is granted to those who visit any parish church or public oratory and the recite one Our Father and one Credo.

All indulgences whatsoever may be applied to the Poor Souls at any time by way of suffrage. (The simple intention to offer them for the Poor Souls is sufficient.)

On Nov. 2, three masses will be offered: the first mass will be at 6:00 am immediately followed by the second, after which communion will be distributed if necessary. The normal 8:00 am mass will be the third mass offered with the normal confession time preceding. One may receive holy communion twice in one day.
